Values

- Catalyst for Change: We strive to be part of the catalyst for change in Alabama's health care environment.
- Solidarity: We believe change and innovation occurs when we combine our talents and work together, and we seek to collaborate with diverse individuals, professionals, organizations, and groups.
- Social Responsibility: We seek to kindle an interest in civic engagement and social responsibility within Alabama.
- **Advocacy**: We believe that each individual has a powerful voice that deserves to be heard.
- Access: We work to improve access to quality healthcare within Alabama.

Beliefs

- 1. We believe that every member of our community is valuable.
- 2. Therefore, we believe in the primacy of individual rights, including the right to privacy in all matters related to personal health, the right to dignity in treatment, and the ultimate authority, of every person, to determine the course of her or his own medical care.
- 3. We believe that preventable suffering should be prevented.
- 4. We believe that a significant portion of the preventable suffering in our community derives from lack of basic health care access.
- 5. We believe that this lack of access disproportionately harms our most vulnerable neighbors.
- 6. Recognizing this injustice, we believe it is our sacred duty, as physicians-in-training, to serve our community, through education and advocacy.
- 7. Indeed, we believe it is our responsibility to expand the narrative, to present an honest account of the real-world suffering secondary to the selective provision of medical care.
- 8. We believe that the truth we present has the capacity to change hearts and minds
- 9. We believe that our efforts to effectuate this change are the natural manifestation of our duty to prevent injustice

- What scarifies have you had to make in order to pay for healthcare?
- How has not having health insurance impacted your life?
- Have you tried to get health insurance converge? What was that experience like for you?
- 2) Share
- 3) Encourage

Alabama Gov. Explores Block-Grant Approach To Medicaid Expansion

Gov. Robert Bentley emphasized Thursday that his administration is in the early stages of considering this approach. In other Medicaid news, members of a Wyoming state legislative panel endorsed an Indiana-style expansion plan.

Gov. Robert Bentley says he is exploring the idea of a state-created program that uses Medicaid expansion dollars to bring health care coverage to previously uninsured people living at or slightly above the poverty line. He emphasized Thursday his administration is only in the early stages of looking at a state-designed program. Bentley said he is also uncertain if the federal government would approve the work requirements he wants for recipients. (12/18)
